If your pets are not spayed or neutered, is there a specific reason why (cost, want to breed, etc.)?

Recipients receiving pet food assistance understand and agree to the following:

- To qualify for assistance, applicant must be a resident of Philadelphia County, applicant must have proof of low income, and all pets must be spayed/neutered, or applicant must agree to have pets spayed/neutered.
- Recipient agrees not to breed their pets, or acquire more while requesting food assistance.
- Recipient understands this service is temporary assistance, and is not meant to be a permanent source of food for the pet. Recipient's needs will be reevaluated following three consecutive months of assistance.
- Recipient agrees to request only the food needed, so that as many households as possible are able to receive assistance.
- Recipient understands ACCT cannot guarantee brand, type, or quality of food.
- Recipient understands proof of residence, proof of income, and proof of spay/neuter are required to receive food. Food may be released without complete documentation, at the discretion of ACCT staff, **one time only**. To utilize the ACCT Pet Food Pantry again in the future, recipient will bring all requested documentation.
